**Parish celebrates Eucharistic Adoration Chapel

Fourteen Holy Helpers Parish in Gardenville has been privileged to offer an opportunity to enrich our faith community with the addition of a Eucharistic Adoration chapel since 2003. The chapel is located in the convent and is open for adoration on Monday through Thursday from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. The monstrance containing the Holy Eucharist is never covered and is never left unattended.

When entering the chapel, you do not just go through a door, you enter into the heart of Jesus and He enters your heart also. In adoration, you can be confident of the love of His true presence. The silence of the chapel frees you from the cross of life and you can rest in His promise of giving rest to all you who are burdened.

In the ensuing five years, we have enjoyed the sharing of faith in our small team (really a family) of about 125 members. We have prayed for each other, asked for prayers for ourselves, rejoiced in prayers answered, and offered Masses for our team members, families and friends who have returned to God.

We have raised money to purchase a sign proclaiming the Eucharistic Adoration chapel and planted a garden to enhance the area surrounding the sign. The seasonal decoration of our chapel is supported with free will donations. Memorials have been offered to remember beloved family members. In the Year of the Eucharist declared by Pope John Paul II from October 2004 to October 2005, we celebrated with a traditional Corpus Christi procession.

Each person on the team commits to one hour of adoration per week. Each person plans their hour to be a gift to Jesus Christ in return for the three hours of agony He endured for all of us. In their hour, the person chooses their own use of time including silent meditation, reflecting on the monthly intentions, praying for loved ones or offering a rosary to the Blessed Mother. We have all gladly answered yes to His call of, “Could you not keep watch for one hour?” (Mark 31:37).

A very important part of this case is the fact that throughout her 20 year coma, Sara could see, hear and understand what was going on around her’.”
